Craig is a Certified Arborist, an ISA-Qualified Tree Risk Assessor and a head technician for the International Tree Climbing Championship. He is also a member of the TCI Magazine Editorial Advisory Board. Craig founded Tree133 in 2017 with the mission of "Preserving Trees. Empowering People." His team of professional arborists specializes in the care of large trees with risk mitigation pruning, structural support systems and cultural improvements. They strive to empower tree owners with science-based guidance that considers both the risks and benefits of trees. In early 2020, Craig's wife, Joanna Bachmann, joined Tree133 to manage daily operations. Her expertise has been essential to the success of the business.
